### NOTICE TO VOTERS OF DEADLINE FOR ARGUMENTS FOR OR AGAINST A CITY MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY CLERK

NOTICE IS GIVEN that on Tuesday, November 6, 2012 a Special Municipal Election will be held in the City of San José, at which there will be submitted to the voters the following measures:

#### **MINIMUM WAGE**

Shall an ordinance be adopted that (1) requires (a) payment of minimum wages in San José at \$10 per hour with an annual increase, if any, based on the Consumer Price Index beginning January 1, 2014; (b) City enforcement through fines, penalties, civil actions, or revocation or suspension of permits or licenses; and (c) voter approval of substantive changes to the ordinance; and (2) allows private enforcement through civil actions?

#### **CARDROOM GAMING**

Shall gambling be expanded by amending the Municipal Code to (1) allow the maximum number of Card Tables at San José's two cardrooms to increase by 30 on January 1, 2013 and by an additional 30 on January 1, 2014; (2) allow Cardrooms to offer any form of gaming lawful in California after July 1, 2012, without additional voter approval; and (3) require San José to review rules for additional permissible gaming?

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NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the legislative body of the City, or any member or members thereof authorized by the body, or any individual voter or bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of voters and associations, may file a written argument, not to exceed 300 words in length, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers, for or against the City measure(s).

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, based upon the time reasonably necessary to prepare and print the arguments and sample ballots for the election, the City Clerk has fixed **12:00 Noon, Tuesday, August 14, 2012** during normal office hours, as posted, as the deadline for arguments for or against the City measure to be submitted to the clerk for printing and distribution to the voters as provided in the Article 4. Arguments shall be submitted to the City Clerk, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers, at the City Hall, San Jose, California. Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until the deadline fixed by the City Clerk.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that all ballot materials, including full text of the proposed measure, impartial analysis, arguments or rebuttals filed under the authority of the Elections Code will be available for public examination in the Office of the City Clerk for 10 calendar days from the deadline for the filing of each ballot material.
