

## MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

**SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA**

**TUESDAY, AUGUST 3, 2004**

The Council of the City of San Jose convened in Regular Session at 9:35 a.m. in Council Chambers at City Hall.

City of San José, et al.; (B) to confer with Legal Counsel regarding anticipated litigation (a) of a matter where there is significant exposure to litigation pursuant to subsection (b) of Section 54956.9 of the Government Code and (2) to discuss two matters in the initiation of litigation pursuant to subsection (c) of Section 54956.9 of the Government Code.
