

**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL**

**SAN JOSÉ, CALIFORNIA**

**TUESDAY, MARCH 21, 2006**

The Council of the City of San Jose convened in Regular Session at 9:32 a.m. in Mayor's Conference Room T1841, at City Hall.

Council Member Reed stated that because of concerns over anticipated budget shortfalls, the 1.5% increase already approved is adequate and he does not support the motion.

Considerable Council discussion ensued, and on a call for the question to amend the motion, the motion by Council Member Reed failed. (3-8). Noes: Campos, Chavez, Chirco, Pyle, Williams, LeZotte, Nguyen; Gonzales.

Action: On a call for the question on the original motion, Council approved the memorandum from Vice Mayor Chavez and Council Members LeZotte, Chirco, and Pyle, dated March 8, 2006, recommending Council direct staff to develop a work plan for implementing the Sunshine Reforms and report back to the City Council during the budget process with a workplan including specific recommendations as soon as possible, with additional direction to staff to return in two weeks with a recommendation on how to engage the public in the process, i.e., task force, working group, or other. (10-1). Noes: Gonzales.
