On April 7, 2006, the City Council is scheduled to conduct a study session regarding the Coyote Valley Specific Plan and its transportation issues. The purpose of the study session is to engage the Council in a discussion about linking land use and transportation in Coyote Valley to achieve a community that is based on pedestrian, bicycle, and transit modes first while still accommodating car travel.
