RECOMMENDATIONS

Reverse the Planning Commission decision to allow the proposed extended hours for Palermo's Restaurant.

- 2 Modify the Conditional Use Permit by adding a condition prohibiting the presence of persons under 21 years of age when any part of Palermo's premises is open as a nightclub or has other non-incident entertainment use. (The current and proposed amended CUP does not have an age restriction condition. Because restaurants allow minors on their premises anytime they are open, a clarification must be made when the facility has the added entertainment/nightclub use. This is in keeping with the nightclub guidelines.)

BACKGROUND

On April 14, 2004, the Planning Commission voted 5-0-2 to approve a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to extend hours of late night use until 5:00 a.m. on Saturdays and Sundays to Palermo's Restaurant/Nightclub. On May 1, 2004, the West of 4th Street Neighborhood Group filed a permit appeal of the Planning Commission's decision to approve the CUP. The appeal expressed concern that the extended hours would create a public nuisance for area residents, and the San Jose Police can provide only limited security after 2:30 a.m. This memo is intended to address police security concerns.

ANALYSIS

1. Police Staffing in the Downtown

The downtown area is in Police District Edward ("E"). District "E" has a high concentration of alcoholic beverage consumption (ABC) establishments that primarily focus on food service

and/or entertainment. These businesses create a large public draw to the downtown area. Problems associated with these types of businesses include public drunkenness, disturbances, fights, and crowd and traffic control, all of which create significant policing problems.

There are four police beats in the district, and normal staffing is one officer per beat, plus a supervisor. Two of the four police beats in District "E" are significantly above the 20% Crime Index. Officers from adjoining police districts must assist with the disturbances that occur regularly in District "E" during the early morning hours associated with nightclub activity and alcohol consumption. This has a direct impact on the delivery of service throughout the City, particularly because police staffing is at a minimum during the early morning hours.

The Entertainment District was created as a response to the problems associated with the ABC establishments in District "E." A supervising sergeant was assigned to oversee the primary entertainment evenings on Wednesday through Saturday nights, from 5:00 PM to 3:00 AM. A limited number of officers were assigned to the sergeant on an overtime basis to support him. Budget limitations have reduced overtime funds, resulting in a decrease in the number of officers and hours they are allowed to work in the downtown area. This decrease in staffing places greater responsibility on the assigned beat officers in the downtown police district.

There is overlap of the swing and midnight units throughout the city between approximately 10:00 PM and 12:30 AM. This enables the department to have resources to cover the busiest hours of the night. After 12:30 AM, the midnight shift is solely responsible for patrolling the city. After 12:30 AM, Monday through Wednesday and after 2:30 AM the rest of the week, the only additional police resources to call on for disturbances in District "E" are the patrol officers in the adjoining police districts.

The Police Department's Crime Analysis Unit has provided attachments that illustrate the concentration and nature of activity in the downtown area and its relationship with alcohol.

Attachment I is a Crime Analysis Report Summary and Pin Map of the Downtown Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) Locations and their related Police Beats. Attachment II is a Crime Statistics Pin Map and List of Reported Incidents within 1000 feet of 394 S. 2nd Street. Attachment III is a Crime Statistics Pin Map and List of Calls for Service and Self-Initiated Events within 1000 feet of 394 S. 2nd Street. Attachment IV is an Alcohol Analysis Report and a Pin Map of the Downtown ABC Locations and their related census tracts.

The number of police contacts involving drunk-in-public disturbances, and vehicle and pedestrian stops are indicative of alcohol and entertainment venues. The busiest hours on Thursday through Sunday are approximately 10:00 PM to 2:00 AM, with a sharp drop off in calls by 3:00 AM. These hours are the entertainment hours, and the number of police contacts decrease simply because the entertainment businesses have closed. If business hours are extended, the number of police contacts will inevitably increase.

2. Alcohol Beverage License and Entertainment Venue Concentration in the Downtown

The downtown area over the years has become seriously over-concentrated with Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) Licenses. Two of the census tracts have 109 active and 11 pending On-Sale (Bar, Restaurant, Nightclub, etc.) ABC licenses in the downtown area. There are also

11 active and two pending Off-Sale (Markets, Liquor Store, Etc.) ABC Licenses. ABC guidelines recommend a total of seven On-Sale and four Off-Sale ABC Licenses for these two census tracts. This concentration of alcohol and entertainment-related venues has created a significant draw for young adults, effectively making the downtown area an **adult entertainment zone**.

3. The Relative Immaturity of Downtown Nightclub Patrons

Young adults and teenagers under 21 years of age comprise the majority of people who frequent the downtown area, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights when the entertainment venues are usually open from 10:00 PM until 2:00 AM. Most incidents involving crowd control, disturbances, traffic control, assaults, public intoxication, noise, vandalism, and similar crimes involve patrons in this age range. A large motor vehicle cruise that occurs in the downtown area also draws young adults and teenagers. After the nightclubs, restaurants and bars close, some patrons loiter in the downtown area and continue to drink, urinate in public, create disturbances, and vandalize property unless encouraged to leave by the police.

4. Nightclub Entertainment/After 2:00 AM Hours, for Persons Under-21 Downtown, will Adversely Affect Public Safety

Several downtown establishments other than Palermo's have expressed interest in attracting age 18 and above entertainment. As the analysis has shown, the downtown area is essentially an adult entertainment zone because of its concentration of ABC licenses and entertainment-related venues. The mix of patrons under 21 years of age in an area that is so heavily concentrated with alcohol establishments creates an unacceptable risk to the welfare of the underage patrons and to the general community.

Restaurants can allow a minor to enter at any time the restaurant is open, regardless of the minor's age. Curfew laws are not applicable because as long as the minor is going to or from, or is within the restaurant, there is no curfew violation. This creates problems with minors loitering about late-night establishments, indicating they are waiting to be picked up or are going into the establishment. This was a constant problem with the old *San Jose Live* and *Tropicana Clubs* that had under-21 venues.

If Palermo's is allowed to remain open past 2:00 AM, patrons from other area clubs and restaurants that have closed will be drawn to that location. There will be greater potential for loitering, drinking in parking lots, and public nuisance that requires police intervention.

5. Public Safety Concerns for Neighbors

In the immediate area north of Palermo's is a high-density Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) Residential Facility, with residential areas to the east. The potential for the young ladies in the YWCA facility to become victims is very real when a large number of young males who have been drinking are allowed to remain in the downtown area.

The crime statistics show there is already a problem in the area around Palermo's with public intoxication, disturbances, assaults (battery), and vandalism. The extended hours are likely to add to these problems.

6. Domino Effect of Upholding the Planning Commission's Decision

Palermo's request for extended hours doesn't exist in a vacuum. Extended hours have been granted to some non-alcoholic restaurants in the downtown area, with others pending review. A couple of nightclub/restaurants downtown also have existing extended hours (*Senora Emma's* and *The Agenda*) have CUPs that allow operation until 4:00 AM. There are several other businesses in the downtown area that would like to have the extended hours and attract the under-21 crowd. Granting the ever-increasing requests for extended operating hours to downtown establishment will seriously hamper the Police Department's ability to adequately serve and protect area residents and patrons.

ATTACHMENT I-A

CRIME ANALYSIS REPORT

Business and Professions Code Section 23958.4(c)(1) defines a reporting district as a geographical area within the boundaries of a single government entity (city or the unincorporated area of the county) that are identified by the local law enforcement agency in the compilation and maintenance of statistical information on reported crimes and arrests. In the City of San Jose that geographical area is a police beat.

Business and Professions Code Section 23958.4(c)(2) defines reported crimes as the most recent yearly compilation by the local law enforcement agency of reported offences of criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny theft, and vehicle theft, combined with all arrests for other crimes, both felonies and misdemeanors, except traffic citations. These crimes are often referred to as Part 1 or Index Crimes, which are the more serious crimes, tracked.

Palermo's is located in San Jose Police Beat E4. Since the reported crime statistics as defined by B&P Section 23958.4(c)(2) **are not** over the 20% crime index, the location **is not** considered unduly concentrated per B&P Section 23958.4 (a)(1).

However, this conclusion does not accurately reflect the public safety story in the Downtown area. All of the police beats in District E are below the city average of indexed crimes. The arrests in Police Beat E2 are 118% over the average arrest rate for the city, and the arrests in Beat E3 are 102% over the average arrest rate. While Police Beat E4 is only 6 % over the average arrest rate for the city, its proximity to the significantly impacted Police Beats E2 and E3 creates a resource drain of officers out of Police Beat E4 at times when there are any over-load of calls in Police Beats E2 and E3.

These are extremely heavy arrest rates in relation to their low index crime numbers and indicate that there is a significant number of non-indexed crime arrests and even more contacts that do not result in arrests.

The reported crime statistics as defined by B&P Section 23958.4(c)(2) only takes into account the seven major reported Index Crimes and does not reflect the multitude of other reported

crimes that actually are received in any given reporting district. Reported crimes such as drunk in public, disturbances, crowd control, fights, traffic control and many others actually take up a significant amount of police resources and time. These are typical types of crimes associated with entertainment establishments. Some of these crimes would be reflected in the arrest statistics, but in a majority of these types of crimes no arrests are made, so they would not be reflected in the Index Crimes figures. A more accurate gauge of the activity would be an in-depth crime analysis of all reported incidents, calls for service and self initiated events.

During 2003, there were a total of 8 reported incidents, calls for service and self-initiated events at 394 S. 2nd Street. The nature of the calls is listed in the table below.

There were 2,759 reported incidents and calls for service and self initiated events within 1000 feet of 394 S. 2nd Street in 2003. The top five reported incidents and calls for service are listed in the table below. There will be some minor duplication of events in the reported incident report and the calls for service and self-initiated reports.

The attached crime statistics report with accompanying pin maps lists the reported incidents and the calls for service and self-initiated events within a 500 feet and 1000 feet of 394 S. 2nd Street. As the pin maps show, police activity in the area is concentrated on the main corridors of Market St., S. 1st St, S. 2nd St., S. 3rd St. and S. 4th St. The heavy concentration of police contacts within a 500 feet and 1000 feet of the business is a grave concern.

The attached **Downtown ABC Locations with Police Beats Map** gives a good overview of the concentration of ABC licenses in the downtown area as related to the police beats. Note: The pin map is updated for census tracts 5008.00 and 5009.01 only. There are other ABC locations that are not shown in this or the Census Tract Map attached to the Alcohol Analysis Report.







ALCOHOL ANALYSIS REPORT

Palermo's currently has a valid Type 47 On-Sale Public Eating Establishment ABC License and has a Public Entertainment Permit issued by the San Jose Police Department. Palermo's is not in a Project Crackdown, Weed and Seed Area or Strong Neighborhood Initiative (SNI) Area. There are residences to the north and east of 394 South 2nd Street.

Department of Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) records indicate Palermo's is in census tract 5009.01. Pursuant to B&P Section 23958.4 (a)(2) ...the ratio of on-sale retail licenses to population in census tract 5009.01 does exceed the ratio of on-sale retail licenses to population in the county in which the applicant premises are located.
