SUBJECT: MCKEE NO. 132. REORGANIZATION/ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF SAN JOSE OF AN APPROXIMATELY 10.57-ACRE COUNTY POCKET CONSISTING OF ONE (1) 10.57 GROSS ACRE PARCEL LOCATED ON THE SOUTHWESTERLY CORNER OF CAPITOL AVENUE AND GIMELLI WAY.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council at a public hearing on November 14, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. adopt a resolution initiating proceedings, and setting January 9, 2007 at 7:00 p.m. for a public hearing on the reorganization of territory designated as McKee No. 132 which involves the annexation to the City of San Jose of approximately 10.57 gross acres of land located on the southwesterly corner of Capitol Avenue and Gimelli Way, and the detachment of the same from the appropriate special districts including Central Fire Protection and Area No. 01 (Library Services) County Service Districts. A map showing the affected territory is attached.

OUTCOME

Upon completion of the annexation/reorganization proceedings, the territory designated McKee No. 132 will be within the incorporated area of the City of San José and eligible to receive City services. Implementation of the annexation would result in the detachment of properties within the annexation area from the special districts which include Central Fire Protection and Area No. 01 (Library Services) County Service Districts.

BACKGROUND

On April 26, 2006, the City Council voted to provide direction to City staff to proceed with a County island annexation program which involves the annexation of all unincorporated County pockets less than 150-acres in size. On August 8, 2006 the City Council approved the proposed phasing for the annexation of the County pockets. The City of San Jose is initiating the annexation of the subject area as a part of Phase 1 of this program.

A Planning Director-initiated Prezoning (File No. C06-044) was processed to assign a City of San Jose zoning district to the site in preparation for annexation. The prezoning was heard by the Planning Commission on September 13, 2006 and by the City Council on September 19, 2006. The approved R-M Multiple Residence Zoning District will allow residential uses consistent with the Transit Corridor Residential (20+ DU/AC) General Plan designation, the Zoning Code, the existing neighborhood and the existing uses on the subject property.

ANALYSIS

The proposed annexation and the prezoning to R-M Multiple Residence Zoning District will allow residential uses consistent with the Zoning Code, the existing neighborhood and the existing uses and/or structures on the subject property. The proposed annexation is being done as part of the first phase of the County island annexation process as it has been determined that it will create a negligible impact on City services because of its size, location and number of inhabitants.

Although this item does not meet any of the above criteria, outreach will occur consistent with Council Policy 6-30: Public Outreach for Pending Land Use and Development Proposals. A notice of the public hearing was distributed to the owners and tenants of all properties located within 300 feet of the project site and posted on the City website. The rezoning was also published in a local newspaper, the Post Record. This staff report is also posted on the City's website. An Answer Book has been distributed to all residents and property owners within the areas to be annexed as a part of Phase I of the program. Staff has also been available to respond to questions from the public.

COORDINATION

The project was coordinated with the Departments of Transportation, Fire, Police, Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services, Environmental Services, Public Works, Library, and the Redevelopment Agency. These departments are participating in a working group to coordinate, discuss and resolve issues associated with the annexation efforts

FISCAL/POLICY ALIGNMENT

This project is consistent with the City Council's direction to initiate annexation of unincorporated islands of less than 150-acres.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

The proposed annexation is being done as part of the first phase of the County island annexation process as it has been determined that it will create a negligible impact on City services because of its size, location and number of inhabitants.

CEQA

The environmental impacts of this project were addressed by a Final EIR entitled, "San José 2020 General Plan," and certified on August 16, 1994, by the City of San José City Council.
