**A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE
MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS REGARDING THE
EXPENDITURE OF REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FUNDS FOR
CERTAIN PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN THE GREATER GARDNER
STRONG NEIGHBORHOODS INITIATIVE REDEVELOPMENT
PROJECT AREA**

WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes a redevelopment agency, with the consent of the legislative body, to pay for the costs of certain public improvements if the legislative body determines that: 1) the public improvements benefit the project area; 2) no other reasonable means of financing the improvements are available to the community, and 3) payment for the improvements will assist in the elimination of blight in the project area and is consistent with the implementation plan; and

WHEREAS, the Council has received and considered that certain memorandum entitled "Determinations Regarding Funds Transferred to the City for Public Improvement Project" from the Development Officer of the Redevelopment Agency of the City of San José to the City's Capital Budget Coordinator, dated February 2, 2009 which includes a discussion of certain public improvements in the Greater Gardner Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Redevelopment Project Area (the "Project Area"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Area was created pursuant to the provisions of the California Community Redevelopment Law (California Health and Safety Code Sections 33000, *et. seq.*) and the adoption of a redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the adoption of the redevelopment plan, the Redevelopment Agency has determined that blighting conditions exist within the Project Area and that the implementation of various public improvements is an element of the redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, the implementation plan for the Project Area includes the modification of existing northbound lanes on Bird Avenue in order to provide a better transition from one lane south of Coe Avenue to three lanes at Virginia Street through the installation of bike lane signs and markings along with cross-hatched markings adjacent to the existing median island; and

WHEREAS, the improvements referenced in the February 2, 2009 Memorandum are intended to accomplish the goal of eliminating blight within the Project Area by improving the neighborhood safety, traffic circulation, and pedestrian safety, making the neighborhood a more pedestrian friendly place to live and visit; and

WHEREAS, the City's capital budget does not include funding for these public improvements and there are no other reasonable means of financing the project;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE:

- A. The City Council hereby determines, based upon the information contained in the Memorandum from the Development Officer dated February 2, 2009 that Redevelopment Agency funding of the modification of existing northbound lanes on Bird Avenue in order to provide a better transition from one lane south of Coe Avenue to three lanes at Virginia Street:
1. Will benefit the impacted Redevelopment Project Area; and
 2. Cannot be reasonably funded by other means; and
 3. Will assist in the elimination of blight in the Project Area by improving neighborhood safety, traffic circulation, and pedestrian safety, making the neighborhood a more pedestrian friendly place to live and visit ; and
 4. Is consistent with the implementation plan for the Project Area.
- B. The City Council hereby consents to the Redevelopment Agency's funding of those public improvements.
