In the fall of last year, I introduced a proposal at the Rules Committee that would direct staff to revise the City's Library Internet Access and Computer Use Policy. In response to the direction given by the Rules Committee, Library staff reviewed four different examples of filtering technology. This test was described in a report that was heard by the Rules Committee. The report claims that the available filtering technology was not effective. It claims that the filters allowed pornographic websites to be viewed or resulted in under-blocking. It further claims that there were a number of legitimate health websites that were not allowed or over-blocked.

These claims of over-blocking gave me the greatest concern. Legitimate research must be accessible in San José Public Libraries. Therefore, I conducted my own research and met with a number of companies that provide internet blocking software. I learned that the technology is more sophisticated than what was reported in the Library staff memo and that over half of the Library systems in the country utilize filtering software. The Phoenix Library system uses Websense filtering software, which is the same software that the City of San José uses to filter the computers used by city employees.

I traveled to Phoenix on a personal trip to visit family. While there, I took an additional day to meet with Phoenix library staff and discuss their experience with Websense. I was informed that the Phoenix City Council made a policy decision to draft an internet and computer use policy that prohibited the viewing of pornographic websites in Phoenix Libraries. Phoenix library staff informed me that their annual filtering expenses were far less than the San José Library staff estimate and that the Websense software can be configured to address the issues of both over and under-blocking. I performed the San José Library staff test on a Phoenix library computer and it performed flawlessly. After returning from Phoenix I discussed the results of my test with the San José Chief Information Officer (CIO) and Library Director. The Library Director and CIO agreed that the Websense software could be configured to perform better than it did in their test, but that it was not their intention to test the software any further. However, the CIO agreed to provide me with a laptop outfitted with Websense configured as it is Phoenix.

My office conducted many hours of filtering tests and found that the Phoenix configuration performed far better than the results reported in the May 15th Library Staff Report. I felt it would be helpful to provide a public presentation of the Phoenix configured Websense, because many individuals interested in this issue were using the Library staff report as their primary reference for the

effectiveness of the filtering technology. The public didn't get to see the Library staff test in action only the published results. I wanted the public to have an opportunity to see the filtering software in action and have the opportunity to participate in a demonstration.

On May 30th, I hosted a presentation of internet filtering software. This is the same software that the city currently uses to filter city employee computers. This presentation was not a policy discussion; my goal was simply to address concerns that had been raised to me about the sophistication of the available filtering technology.

This meeting was publicly noticed through the City Clerk's office in order to allow all council offices and members of the public to attend. The meeting was posted on the City Calendar and at City Hall, per our public outreach policy. I also requested that it be posted to the online Master Calendar.

I sent an email invitation to everyone who had contacted me regarding the issue by email. I personally called the Director of the San José office of the ACLU and invited her to participate in the meeting. My office called the Library department to invite the Director and asked her to share the information with the Friends of the Library and Library Commission. The outreach worked as there were a number of council offices represented at the presentation, as well as representatives from the ACLU, Library Commission, Planned Parenthood and members of the press.

I prepared for this presentation by reviewing all of the websites and research topics identified in the May 14th Library staff report. I developed a list of these websites and research topics with descriptions of what happened in the Library staff test compared to what happened in my test. I have attached that document to this memo.

At the May 30th presentation, I began by going through the list I had developed. The results were consistent with what is described in the attachment. There was no evidence of over or under-blocking. After a half hour of presenting the results of the test I wanted to give the public an opportunity see the filtering software operate in practical real life situations. The public offered websites and research topics to test the software. I received almost two dozen requests. Of those there was only one website that was over-blocked (clothingwhore.com). The majority of requests attempted to bypass the filters and allow porn viewing. Without exception every pornographic site was blocked, and most importantly, the access to health information, educational or research sites were not blocked.

The presentation showed that the filtering software is far more sophisticated than stated in the library staff report and effective in blocking inappropriate, obscene material while allowing full access to information and research.

Staff's report states, "Workarounds to "fool" the filter were also easily successful in every test filter...getting to an adult site through a seemingly innocent "portal" site (like Linkbase.org) to get around the filters... or using a site like Peacefire.org whose sole purpose is to provide users with a one-click workaround for filtering systems."

Staff's Report states, "... you can get around the filter's parameters by searching for "pron" instead of "porn"..."

When you search "pron" the results will have a mix of pornographic sites and legitimate research, non-pornographic, sites. The filter blocked all pornographic sites and allowed all non=pornographic sites.

Staff's report referenced the "See No Evil: How Internet Filters Affect the Search for Online Health Information" article by the Kaiser Family Foundation. This article says that filters tested blocked general health information sites. A list of "blocked" sites is given.

This list is pages 1-4 in this report. None of the sites were blocked by the filter.

Staff's report states, "Keyword searching results in general inconsistencies in what is and isn't blocked (e.g. "women's asses" is allowed but "Shakespeare and sex" isn't".

In my research, I found this to be untrue. I was able to research both topics. The filter worked correctly in every result. All sites that were able to be viewed were non-pornographic.
