**SUBJECT: SUMMARY VACATION OF A 10-FOOT PUBLIC SERVICE EASEMENT
AND A 5-FOOT WIRE CLEARANCE EASEMENT**

RECOMMENDATION

Adoption of a resolution summarily vacating a 10-foot Public Service Easement and a 5-foot Wire Clearance Easement lying in the northerly and southerly boundaries of Lot 164, Tract 3451, APN 595-19-158, on Mylinda Drive.

OUTCOME

Council adopts a resolution summarily vacating a 10-foot Public Service Easement and a 5-foot Wire Clearance Easement lying in the northerly and southerly boundaries of Lot 164, Tract 3451, APN 595-19-158, on Mylinda Drive.

BACKGROUND

On March 10, 2009, the Council adopted a resolution summarily vacating a 10-foot Public Service Easement (PSE) and a 5-foot Wire Clearance Easement (WCE) on Lot 163 of Tract 3451. This summary vacation was completed to facilitate development of Lot 163. Upon receiving additional information from the property owner, Lakhwinder S. Bhangoo, staff now is proposing to vacate similar easements on the neighboring property on Lot 164 of Tract 3451. Lakhwinder S. Bhangoo is also the property owner of Lot 164 of Tract 3451 and has submitted an application to vacate a 10-foot Public Service Easement (PSE) and a 5-foot Wire Clearance Easement (WCE) lying in the northerly and southerly boundaries of Lot 164, Tract 3451 (map attached).

The PSE and WCE were created through the recordation of Tract No. 3451 recorded in Book 165 of Maps at pages 52 through 53, Santa Clara County Records, on August 29, 1963. This application for vacation is needed to remove these encumbrances from the property and allow the owner to develop his property.

ANALYSIS

Staff has determined that these portions of the easements lying within the property are not needed for public purposes and can be vacated without adverse effects. All concerned utility companies have been contacted in writing and have no objection to this vacation. In addition, these portions of the easement do not contain any public facilities and have not been used for the purpose for which it was originally acquired, since its inception, which then allows for this summary vacation.

According to the title report issued by First American Title Company, dated October 14, 2008, Lakhwinder S. Bhangoo and Pal K. Bhangoo, husband and wife, hold fee ownership to the property. Upon vacation of the PSE and WCE, these encumbrances will be removed and no further action by staff would be required.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

This project addresses Public Works performance measures to maintain a 100% cost-recovery program by charging service fees to pay for the staff time involved in this easement vacation process.

If Council adopts this resolution summarily vacating the subject PSE and WCE, no further action by staff would be required.

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COORDINATION

The vacation has been coordinated with the appropriate public utility companies, Departments of Transportation, Police, Fire and the City Manager's Budget Office. In addition, the vacation and required resolution have been reviewed by the City Attorney's Office. All appropriate public utility companies have consented to the proposed vacation.

FISCAL/POLICY ALIGNMENT

Vacating this PSE and WCE is in alignment with the Mayor's June 2008 Budget Message in that this action will reduce a potential City liability.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS


The Public Works Department collected cost-recovery fees to process this easement vacation.
