Action: Upon motion by Council Member Liccardo, seconded by Council Member Herrera, and carried unanimously, authorization for the City Attorney to execute a Settlement Agreement and Release to settle the case of Licking v. City of San José was approved, and [Ordinance No. 28658](#) was adopted.

Jerry Mungai and Dennis Martin (NAIOP Silicon Valley) offered input on reducing the cost of City government. Gay Gale (CAMP) presented a chart with populations indicated by retiree healthcare coalition labor leaders and asked for greater differentiation between different type of contracts. Ed Rast posed questions regarding budget guidelines

Council discussion followed regarding Council policy on open meetings for labor negotiations. City Attorney Richard Doyle agreed to return to Council with more details on open meeting policies prior to the November 5, 2009 Budget Priority Setting Session.
