TUESDAY, JANUARY 12, 2010

Council Member Liccardo requested a deferral of two weeks in order to allow more time to review the legislation to make renewable energy and diversion credit accessible to facilities to convert waste to energy or biofuels. Director of Intergovernmental Relations Betsy Shotwell explained that the item was time sensitive.

Council Member Liccardo expressed opposition to the motion; he noted that organizations are opposed and that there should be more opportunity to review the issues.

- 4.2 Approve an ordinance amending Title 5 of the San José Municipal Code to add a new Chapter 5.08 adopting a Citywide Inclusionary Housing Program. CEQA: Exempt. (Housing)
(Deferred from 11/17/09 – Item 4.2 and 12/1/09 – Item 4.2)**

Council Member Nguyen requested the bifurcation of the Citywide Inclusionary Housing Program. Mayor Reed acknowledged that the vote will be taken in two parts.

Director of Housing Leslye Krutko presented a report on the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance and responded to Council questions and comments.

Senior Deputy City Attorney Vera Todorov outlined the amendments and clarifications on the ordinance.

Mayor Reed and Council Member Liccardo provided meeting disclosures.

Motion: Council Member Liccardo moved approval of the Staff recommendations, as amended, minus Communication Hill. Council Member Nguyen seconded the motion. (9-2. Noes: Constant, Oliverio.)

Public Comments: Speaking in support to the Citywide Inclusionary Housing Ordinance were Kerri Hamilton, Citizens for Environmental and Economic Justice (CEEJ), James Zahradka, Law Foundation of Silicon Valley and Tamon Norimoto, Housing and Community Development.

Speaking in opposition to the Citywide Inclusionary Housing Ordinance were David Wall, Crisand Giles, Homebuilders of Northern California, Charles McKeag, Citation Homes, Anil Babbar, Santa Clara County Association of Realtors, David Lanferman, Sheppard, Mullin, Richter & Hampton, and Pat Sausedo, San José Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce.

City Attorney Richard Doyle clarified legal issues and responded to Council questions.

Council Members Constant agreed with several of the speakers that spoke in objection and restated his continued opposition to the policy.

Council Member Oliverio reiterated opposition to a Citywide Inclusionary Housing Ordinance, especially at this time.

Council Member Nguyen stepped out of the meeting at 3:50 p.m. Council Member Nguyen owns property within 500 feet of the subject area and was disqualified from participating in the discussion of the Communications Hill Planning Area Exemption.

4.2 (Cont'd.)

Director of Housing Leslye Krutko provided the Policy Components, Exemptions and clarified minor changes to the ordinance.

Council Member Constant objected to the policy but expressed support to the exemption for Communication Hill.

Council Member Pyle explained her memorandum dated January 11, 2010, which outlined the exemption for Communication Hill.

Public Comments: Speaking in support to memorandum from Council Member Pyle were, Joan Gallo, Hopkins & Carley and Pat Sausedo, San José Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce. David Wall expressed opposition.

Motion: Council Member Pyle moved approval of her memorandum dated January 11, 2010, recommending removing the proposed change in the Inclusionary Ordinance Subsection 5.08.320 G, Section 5: “As of the Operative Date, there has been no construction of residential units in one of more remaining phases of the Residential Development within the Specific Plan area and within forty (40) months of the Operative Date the Developer has obtained City approval of at least one building permit in any such remaining construction phase”. Council Member Constant requested that Staff provide incentives to encourage property owners to upgrade their signs.

Council Member Campos requested that Staff bring the Draft Signage Strategy back to the appropriate Committee before returning to the full Council for consideration. Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel replied that Staff will return to either the Community & Economic Development Committee or the Neighborhood Services and Education Committee before coming back to Council.

Public Comments: Providing comments about the billboards on private property were, Joel Slayton, ZERO1, Pat Sausedo, San José Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce, Scot Valle, Westfield, Gary Gaumann, TD Communications, Erika Justis, 1st Act Silicon Valley, Bob Kieve, Scott Soper and David Wall.

Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel presented an overview on Freeway Signs for Large Shopping Centers.

City Attorney Richard Doyle and Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel responded to Council questions and comments.

Council Member Liccardo requested that Staff explore and report back on alternatives for allowing signs higher than 60 feet.

Motion: Council Member Constant moved approval of Staff Option 1. Council Member Campos seconded the motion. (11-0.)

Motion: Council Member Constant moved approval of Staff Option 2 with the acreage reduced from 25 acres to 15 acres. Council Member Campos seconded the motion. (10-1. Noes: Chirco.)

Mayor Reed requested that Staff return to Council on February 2, 2010 for discussion and direction of the remainder of the policy questions.

Public Comments: Gary Gaumann, TD Communications, suggested that Staff look at Target, Home Depot and other large companies that want to promote signs to their site. Scot Valle, Westfield, suggested that Staff consider the height of the freeway in relation to the signs.

(11-0.) (2) Freeway Signs – (a) Council approved Option 1: Allow freeway signs for shopping centers 25+ acres in size; (11-0.) (b) Council approved Option 2: Allow freeway signs for smaller shopping centers (15+ acres) (10-1. Noes: Chirco.) (c) Staff requested to explore and report back on alternatives for allowing signs higher than 60 feet. Item 4.3 was continued to February 2, 2010. (11-0.)

OPEN FORUM

- (1) Shane Patrick Connolly commented on pension costs and encouraged the Council to restructure the Police and Fire Retirement Boards, allow more public scrutiny on labor negotiations and to negotiate anew and sustainable pension plan.
- (2) Forrest Williams, Santa Clara Valley Science and Engineering Association, issued an invitation to the Science and Technology Fair on March 16 and 17, 2010 at the San José Convention Center.
- (3) Tina Morrill, Friends of Ryland Pool, presented photos of the restoration of Ryland Pool.
- (4) David Wall criticized the Mercury News’ coverage of the San José Police Department and offered solutions for sustainable agriculture to help stimulate the economy.
