

## MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Mayor Reed requested that Staff take a look at how many officers are on overtime, and the reserve officers who are not on overtime, in order to find an opportunity to restructure the staffing to save the promoters a major expense.

Council Member Campos objected to the Staff recommendations and stated she cannot support these events using public funds at this time, considering the City's huge budget deficit.

Public Comments: Ross Signorino expressed support to the Staff recommendations.

Chief Development Officer Paul Krutko, Director of Finance Scott Johnson and Assistant Director of Transportation James Ortball provided the Staff Reports on Development Incentives, Business Tax Suspension and Downtown Parking Incentives.

Motion: Council Member Liccardo moved approval of the Staff recommendations and the memorandum he cosigned with Mayor Reed and Council Members Herrera and Pyle, including additional revisions to Items (2) and (4) of the joint memorandum. Council Member Herrera seconded the motion.

Extensive Council discussion followed.

Council Member Campos expressed opposition to the motion and stated she cannot support it at this time.

Council Member Chu requested to amend the motion to reduce the number of employees to eight with regard to the Business License Tax suspension. Council Member Liccardo declined to accept the amendment.

Mayor Reed provided meeting disclosures.

Council Member Campos encouraged her colleagues to look at a Business Tax Amnesty Program. Council Member Kalra concurred and expressed support to such a program which can help to save jobs.

Public Comments: Expressing support to the Staff recommendations were Kevin Fitzpatrick, Legacy Partners – Legacy Civic Center, Scott Knies, San José Downtown Association, Greg Sellers, Burnham Energy, Doug Feece, Feece Real Estate Group/Community Towers, Pat Sausedo, San José Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce, and John Althoff. Ross Signorino expressed concern that the City Council is focusing too much on the downtown and not in other areas of San José.

Council Member Kalra requested that the City Manager explore other opportunities such as a Business Tax Amnesty Program.

Action: On a call for the question, the motion carried, the Staff recommendations were accepted, as amended by the memorandum from Mayor Reed and Council Members Liccardo, Herrera and Pyle, dated March 12, 2010 as modified, with Staff directed to: (1) Adopt a suspension of business license taxes for the first 1,000 businesses that provide documentary evidence of a new lease or lease renewal (i.e. signed since January 1, 2010) by June 30, 2010, with the requirement that: (a) Businesses can only qualify when they have brought current all past due fees and obligations to the City. (b) Qualifying businesses must have 35 employees or fewer. (2) Adopt a new Parking Incentive Program that offers free parking to any tenant who signs a new or renewed lease: (a) With no more than 50 employees. (b) A duration equal to one half the term of the lease. (c) Up to the maximum of facility space availability (d) *A 50% discount for the term of duration up to two years or half the term of the lease when renewing an existing lease, with a cap of 500 total spaces;* (3) *Staff to return to Council within 120 days either to discuss the progress of the program; or if the Staff is concerned about the rate of usage, Staff to return to Council with any proposed modifications.* (4) Regarding impact fee deferrals: (1) Adopt Staff recommendation to return to the May 2010 City Budget Study Sessions with further discussion. (2) Direct the City Manager to identify, at any time prior to May, any immediate opportunities for incentivizing business investment utilizing the “net new” concept and to bring those to the full Council for consideration with all necessary haste. (5) Partner with the San José/Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce to offer a reduced rate membership at the Chamber for any business qualifying for a City incentive. (6) Business Tax Amnesty Program as a revenue generating idea based upon past history referred to the City Manager. (6-3-2. Noes: Campos, Chu, Kalra. Absent: Constant, Pyle.)

### **9.1 Review and discuss the FY 2010-2011 Mayor’s March Budget Message. (Mayor)**

Mayor Reed presented a brief overview of the Mayor’s Budget Message for Fiscal Year 2010-2011.

Mayor Reed opened the public hearing.

Council Member Liccardo arrived to the meeting at 7:23 p.m.

Public Comments: Providing comments and expressing concerns about employees losing benefits, to allow the Employee Labor Unions to be creative and to come up with viable solutions, to maintain current staffing at the libraries, objecting to the reduction of library hours to three days a week, to align employee salaries with the private sector, to obtain concessions from the Employee Labor Unions, to keep the prevailing/living wages as is, to keep the community centers open, objecting to cutting City services such as public safety, neighborhood parks and to bring employee costs down, were the following speakers: Linda Dittes, La Verne S. Washington, AFSCME MEF/CEO, Sal Ventura, IBEW 332, Ray Simpson, AEA IFPTE 21, Nancy Ostrowski, AEA/CAMP, Judy Purrington, Susan Bailey, Jerry Mungai, Pat Sausedo, San José Silicon Valley Chamber of Commerce, Linda Spencer, Friends of the Almaden Library, Alex Guy, Susan Abele, Therese Wiese, Josue Garcia, Building Trades, Antonina, Lourdes Nuno, CAE, Elisa Koff-Ginsborg, Sylvia Ruiz, SEUI and Bill Erlendson.

Mayor Reed closed the public hearing.

City Manager Debra Figone responded to Council questions and concerns.

Action: Item 9.1 was continued to March 23, 2010.

The Joint Council/Redevelopment Agency Board adjourned at 8:04 p.m.

## PUBLIC HEARINGS

City Clerk Lee Price read the requests for continuance of the applications. Upon motion by Council Member Liccardo, seconded by Council Member Chu, and carried unanimously, the below noted continuances and actions were taken as indicated. (10-0-1. Absent: Constant.)

- 11.2 Consider an ordinance rezoning the real property located on the north side of Auzerais Avenue between Bird Avenue and Royal Avenue from LI Light Industrial to A(PD) Planned Development Zoning District to demolish an existing gas station building and construct a new gas station mini-mart/car wash on a 0.6 gross acre site (395 Bird Avenue) (Vintners Distributors, Inc. Sunny Goyal, Owner/Developer). SNI: Burbank/Del Monte. CEQA: Exempt. Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement and Planning Commission recommend approval (6-0-1). PDC09-023 – District 6 (Continued from 2/23/10 – Item 11.5)**

Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel provided a brief Staff Report.

Mayor Reed opened the public hearing.

Public Comments: The Applicant, speaking on behalf of Sunny Goyal, the Owner/Developer, stated that this was a project that will service the community and bring improvement to the surrounding neighborhood.

Mayor Reed closed the public hearing.

Council Member Oliverio explained that within the last six months Council rejected off-sale liquor licenses in District 5 and District 3 which has impeded grocery stores to come to these areas. He observed that off-sale liquor licenses should be reserved for grocery stores and not gas stations. He encouraged his colleagues to support his motion to deny the planned development.

Motion: Council Member Oliverio moved to deny Item 11.2. Council Member Nguyen seconded the motion.

## 11.2 (Cont'd.)

Council Member Oliverio noted he does not support the off-sale of alcohol at gas stations, even though the application for a Conditional Use Permit was not the issue on the floor tonight.

City Attorney Richard Doyle and Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel responded to Council questions.

Extensive Council discussion ensued.

Council Member Oliverio urged his colleagues to reject the application tonight and added that the Applicant could return at another time to apply for a Conditional Use Permit.

On a call for the question, the motion failed. (4-6-1. Noes: Chirco, Herrera, Kalra, Liccardo, Pyle; Reed. Absent: Constant.)

Council Member Kalra stated that perhaps there was a way to be able to go through with the project. He suggested deferring the application tonight with direction to Staff to continue discussions with the Applicant.

Council Member Oliverio voiced his objection to a deferral of the application.

Action: Upon motion by Council Member Kalra, seconded by Council Member Liccardo and carried, Item 11.2 was deferred and Staff was directed to continue discussions with the Applicant. (9-1-1. Noes: Oliverio. Absent: Constant.)

Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel provided the staff presentation.

Mayor Reed opened the public hearing.

Lewis Wolff, San José Earthquakes, spoke to the merits of the project which will provide significant economic benefits to the City of San José through its positive impact on local businesses, job growth and by hosting a wide variety of unique events at the stadium year round. Keith Wolff and David Allioto provided a brief visual presentation on the proposed 18,000 seat stadium project.

Motion: Council Member Liccardo moved approval of the memorandum he cosigned with Mayor Reed, including additional changes, and Council Member Liccardo read the Statement of Overriding Considerations. Council Member Pyle seconded the motion.

Residents from the Newhall Neighborhood expressed concerns about mitigation measures for the neighborhood such as placing limits on the number of events and restrictions of evening and weekly uses, public participation forums, a firm commitment for mitigation, and concerns about the noise level, pollution and bright lights: Jerome Krinock, Hauke Nehrenheim, Matthew Bright, Benjamin Brooks, Cheryl Foust, Mary Ann Lewis, Joanne Curve and John Urban.

Mayor Reed and Council Member Liccardo provided meeting disclosures.

Director of Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel responded to Council questions and concerns. Discussion followed.

Council Member Kalra requested that Staff provide to the Community & Economic Development Committee progress updates on the overall mitigation plan and timeline for the Hitachi, IStar, Great Oaks and FMC properties; information memorandum about discussions with labor bargaining units for the stadium and hotel sites.

Council Member Campos requested an information memorandum be circulated to Council outlining the construction timeline for the stadium project when it becomes available.

Action: On a call for the question, the motion carried unanimously, the recommendation of the Planning Commission and the Planning Director was approved, A Statement of Overriding Considerations was read into the record: “The Final Environment Impact Report for this proposed project identified significant and unavoidable environmental impacts. However, as described in more detail in the proposed resolution of the EIR findings for this item there is no feasible way to lessen or avoid these significant effects for this project and approval of this proposed project is anticipated to result in several benefits to the City. All of these benefits outweigh the significant, unavoidable environmental impacts identified in the Final EIR for this Project”; the memorandum from Mayor Reed and Council Member Liccardo, dated March, 12, 2010, was approved as amended, with Staff directed to: (1) Make all necessary findings to approve adoption of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) entitled: “Airport West Stadium and Great Oaks Place Project”. (2) Approve Staff recommendation of Planned Development Rezoning to A(PD) Planned Development Zoning District to allow a professional sports stadium with up to 18,000 seats, in addition to the already allowed uses, on an approximately 94.8 acre site, with the additional conditions: (a) Prior to the start of construction, Applicant shall prepare a proposed “Good Neighbor Process” which will confirm the Applicant’s commitment to comply with all mitigation conditioned on the project by the Planning Director as required by the EIR, to provide contact information to local residents for the expression of any concerns and to provide a means for ongoing communication between the Applicant and the surrounding community. (b) Prior to the date of the hearing on the Planned Development Permit, Applicant shall hold one community meeting with City Staff to obtain community input concerning required

mitigation plans by the City of San José. Applicant will be available to respond to any additional community concerns prior to the issuance of the Planned Development Permit. Applicant, along with the project's contractor, shall hold an additional community meeting prior to the start of construction, to address construction related issues. *Community meetings will be held at a time and place convenient for working residents in that community.* (c) Outreach for those community meetings shall include residents and businesses located between Newhall Street and Interstate 880 and the residents of the Newhall neighborhood to the west of the Union Pacific railroad tracks; [Ordinance No. 28727](#), entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of San José Rezoning Certain Real Property Situated at the Northwest and Southwest Corners of Coleman Avenue and Newhall Drive, to A(PD) Planned Development Zoning District", was passed for publication and [CEQA Resolution No. 75309](#) was adopted. Staff agreed to provide to the Community & Economic Development Committee progress updates on the overall mitigation plan and timeline for the Hitachi, IStar, Great Oaks and FMC properties; information memorandum about discussions with labor bargaining units for the stadium and hotel sites; and an information memorandum outlining the construction timeline for the stadium project, when it becomes available. (10-0-1. Absent: Constant.)

### ADJOURNMENT

The Council of the City of San José was adjourned at 10:21 p.m. in memory of J. Lindsey Wolf, a former City employee who was San Jose's first citywide public information officer under Mayor Tom McEnery and who over 22 years guided critical communications efforts both citywide and on behalf of the City's numerous environmental programs.
