



**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL
DISASTER POLICY SEMINAR**

SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA

TUESDAY FEBRUARY 22, 2011

The Council of the City of San José convened in Regular Session at 8:10 a.m. at the Hayes Mansion, 200 Edenvale Avenue, San José, California.

Mayor Reed and City Manager Debra Figone offered introductory remarks.

Director of Emergency Services Christopher A. Godley presented introductory comments. Introductions followed from the City of San José Mayor and Council Members, the City of San José Department Staff Members and the Staff from the Center for Homeland Defense and Security.

Stan M. McKinney, Director of Executive Education Programs, Center for Homeland Defense and Security announced that his department has provided 200 seminars similar to this one from Guam to Puerto Rico and most points in between.

Mr. McKinney remarked that the objectives of the seminar were to enhance the ability of the City Leaders to respond to a major emergency or disaster, install a common understanding of key homeland security policies, emergency management strategies, authorities plans and organizational structure; review and clarify roles and responsibilities of senior City elected and appointed officials and to identify areas of improvement for the emergency management program.

Mr. McKinney provided a presentation on Managing Risks, determining vulnerability was based upon assessing the strengths and weaknesses of systems, people or infrastructure subjected to a threat or impacted by a disaster.

Mr. McKinney defined that a threat was an event or situation, naturally occurring, accidental or of deliberate human origin, which creates or contributes to a disaster. He continued that for a group or individual to be considered a threat, they have to have “intent” and “capability” to carry out the threat.

Robert (Mike) Walker, Chairman, Plexus Scientific Corporation provided the Current Threat Overview highlighting consequences which are the likely outcomes of a disaster in terms of death and injury, public order and safety, continuity of government and essential services, economic stability, the creation of fear, confidence in public and private institutions and other impacts to the essential fabric of society.

Other elements of the presentation included: Understanding consequences and the elements of prevention, the Intelligence Cycle, which included requirements, collection, processing and exploitation, analysis and production, dissemination, consumption and feedback and the National Preparedness Goal priorities.

Director of Communications Tom Manheim reminded everyone about “Alert Santa Clara County” web site: www.alertscc.com currently in place. He explained that it was an effective tool for reaching people in their homes and allowing the public to input cell phone numbers to build that valuable data base.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

David Wall presented comments about water pollution control and the repeated warnings about safety issues related to terrorism.

ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Reed adjourned the meeting at 10:56 a.m.
