This Agenda contains both a Consent Calendar section for routine business items that require Council approval, and general business items arranged to correspond with San José's City Service Areas (CSAs). City Service Areas represent the policy-making level for strategic planning, policy setting, and investment decisions in the critical functions the City provides to the community. They are:

- **Strategic Support Services** — The internal functions that enable the CSAs to provide direct services to the community in an effective and efficient manner.
- **Community & Economic Development** — Manage the growth and change of the community in order to create and preserve healthy neighborhoods and ensure a diverse range of employment and housing opportunities.
- **Neighborhood Services** — Serve, foster, and strengthen community by providing access to lifelong learning and opportunities to enjoy life.
- **Transportation & Aviation Services** — A safe and efficient transportation system that contributes to the livability and economic health of the City; and provide for the air transportation needs of the community and the region at levels that is acceptable to the community.
- **Environment and Utility Services** — Manage environmental services and utility systems to ensure a sustainable environment for the community.
- **Public Safety Services** — Commitment to excellence in public safety by investing in neighborhood partnerships as well as prevention, enforcement, and emergency preparedness services.

Items listed in Section 9 require approval of both the City Council and the San José Redevelopment Agency Board.

You may speak to the City Council about any item that is on the agenda, and you may also speak during Open Forum on items that are not on the agenda and are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the City Council or Redevelopment Agency Board. If you wish to speak to the City Council, please refer to the following guidelines:

- **Fill out a Yellow Speaker's Card and submit it to the City Clerk seated at the front table. Do this before the meeting or before the item is heard.** This will ensure that your name is called for the item(s) that you wish to address, and it will help ensure the meeting runs smoothly for all participants.
- When the Council reaches your item on the agenda, Mayor Reed will open the public hearing and call your name. Please address the Council from the podium, which is located to the left of the City Clerk's table.
- Each speaker generally has two minutes to speak per item. The amount of time allotted to speakers may vary at the Mayor's discretion, depending on the number of speakers or the length of the agenda.
- To assist you in tracking your speaking time, there is a display on the podium. The green light turns on when you begin speaking; the yellow light turns on when you have 30 seconds left; and the red light turns on when your speaking time is up.

Please be advised that, by law, the City Council is unable to discuss or take action on issues presented during Open Forum. According to State Law (the Brown Act) items must first be noticed on the agenda before any discussion or action.

The San José City Council meets every Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 7 p.m. as needed, unless otherwise noted. If you have any questions, please direct them to the City Clerk's staff seated at the tables just below the dais. Thank you for taking the time to attend today's meeting. - (a) Approval of or referral of draft ordinance for review and comment to the Board of Administration of the Federated City Employees Retirement System and the Board of Administration of the Police and Fire Department Retirement Plan – draft ordinance amending Parts 1 and 10 of Chapter 2.08 of Title 2 of the San José Municipal Code to amend Sections 2.08.130, 2.08.160, 2.08.1020 and 2.08.1070 and to add a new Section 2.08.170 to correct clerical errors related to the process for removal of members of the Board of Administration of the Federated City Employees Retirement System and filling vacancies on said Board, to require public members who are appointed to said Board on or after April 1, 2011 to reside within a fifty mile radius of San José City Hall and to clarify Council's intent with respect to the nonvoting member position on the Board of Administration of the Federated City Employees Retirement System and the Board of Administration of the Police and Fire Department Retirement Plan.

Recommendation:

- (1) Authorizing the City to forgive Neighborhood Housing Services of Silicon Valley's (NHSSV) \$1,300,000 obligation to the HomeVenture Fund for past operating expenses and in exchange, accepting NHSSV's commitment to utilize \$1,300,000 in CalHOME grant proceeds within City of San José municipal boundaries.
 - (2) Accepting NHSSV's proposal to repay the City \$1,917 per month over five years for its \$115,000 obligation in HOME Investment Partnership ("HOME") funds.
 - (3) Authorizing the Director of Housing to negotiate and execute all documents related to the fulfillment of the conditions of these recommendations as adopted by the City Council.

6. TRANSPORTATION & AVIATION SERVICES

6.1 Car Share Program.

Recommendation: As recommended by the Transportation and Environment Committee on March 7, 2011, accept staff's report and approve the following incentives to be included in a Request for Proposals for a car share service provider as a means to facilitate the launch of a carsharing program in the City of San José:

- (a) Possible partnership with San José State University;
- (b) Replace a portion of the City fleet with carshare vehicles;
- (c) Provide free parking to car share vehicles in City garages;

Accepted, with Staff directed to incorporate the Mayor’s set of goals to achieve for 2011:

- (1) **Process and install the identified 13 megawatts of solar at City facilities.**
- (2) **Complete the Fog Waste, Zero Waste and Harvest Waste projects.**
- (3) **Complete the audits and plans for upgrading the facilities; begin and complete the upgrades.**

Staff directed to return to Transportation and Environment Committee in September 2011 with an analysis of the cost and benefits of Community Choice Aggregation and how this might look in San José.

Recommendation: Conduct a Public Hearing and approve the FY 2011-2012 Mayor's March Budget Message. (Mayor)

Approved, including the clarification on Page 15, 3(a) Parking Fund Review and Repurpose: that any excess parking funds would be offset parking expenses related to general fund expenses, such as debt service.

Staff directed to include a study session to discuss the pension reform issues on the 1st and 2nd tier designs during the Budget Study Sessions in May 2011.

The Joint Council/Redevelopment Agency adjourned at 3:21 p.m.
