Mayor Reed outlined the ordinances to be prioritized. Assistant City Manager Ed Shikada provided the context for the procedure.

Public Comments: Rich De La Rosa (Garden City Casinos and Casino M8trix) urged prioritization of Title 16 for Gaming Control licensing and work permits; Ellen Prior, Margo Sidener and Maria Francisco (Breathe California), Uka Masada, Dr. Marty Fenstersheib, and Carol Baker (American Cancer Society) asked that Council prioritize “Smoking in outdoor areas”; Speaking on the importance of the “Social Host Ordinance” were Gabrielle Antolovich, Kim Bravo (Urban Coalition), Carla Holtzclaw, and Rogelio (County of Santa Clara); Richard Kondor (Asian Law Alliance), Liana Molina (California Reinvestment Coalition), Steve Preminger (South Bay Labor Council), Ricky Alexander, Kyra Kazantuis (Public Interest Law Firm), and Gregory Kepferle asked that Council prioritize the Payday Lending issue. Mark Trout spoke in opposition to mandatory vaccinations.

Council Member Pyle read a letter from a constituent, emphasizing the dangers of underage drinking and the importance of the social host ordinance.

Director, Planning, Building and Code Enforcement Joseph Horwedel and Director of Economic Development/Chief Strategist Kim Walesh answered questions regarding the special events ordinance.

Motion: Council Member Kalra moved the inclusion of five priority ordinance items rather than three. The motion was seconded by Council Member Herrera. Mayor Reed clarified that an item must get six votes before it can make the priority list. On a call for the question, the motion carried. (10-1-0. Noes: Oliverio.)

City Clerk Dennis Hawkins explained the process by which Council would be voting to prioritize ordinances.

Council Member Campos provided meeting disclosures.

Top ordinances were prioritized by Council as follows:

- (1) Smoking in Outdoor Areas (10 votes)
- (2) Social Host Ordinance (9 votes)
- (3) Payday Lending (9 votes)

Noise Performance Standards Update (1 vote)
