BACKGROUND

Six years ago, the City of San José (City) and County of Santa Clara (County) re-affirmed their commitment to establish a stronger, more productive and effective relationship focused on issues of mutual interest. Since 2006, the Board of Supervisors and the City Council convene an annual joint session to discuss key areas of interest to the community. In addition, the County Executive and the City Manager continue to meet regularly to ensure the highest level of communication and coordination among our staffs on issues, programs and initiatives that are priorities for our Supervisors and our Mayor and Council.

ANALYSIS

The Board and Council have convened six annual joint meetings during the period of 2006-2011. The topic areas for the 2012-13 meeting were selected as being most relevant from a staff and community-wide perspective. City and County staff will make presentations on the following topic areas of interest and they are included as attachments to this joint memorandum:

- (a) Realignment AB 109 and County Re-Entry Program
- (b) City-County Partnership to End Chronic Homelessness
- (c) Downtown Medical Clinic

The City and County reiterate their commitment to ensuring the high quality of life for the residents and businesses in San José and the County of Santa Clara through continued coordination between our organizations and our community stakeholders. By strengthening our professional relationships we become more responsive to the needs of our community.


