DOT AND SJPD SAFETY PROGRAMS

1. School Safety Education – pedestrian and bicycle safety education seminars at 50% of K-8 schools annually. Currently provided by Safe Moves.
2. School Access Enhancement Study - Completed 1st phase (42 schools). Evaluated school drop off/pick-up conditions to reduce traffic congestion, provide a more pedestrian friendly environment, optimize existing facilities, and to expand pedestrian education to parents, educators and students.
3. Street Smarts Campaign – launched in Nov. 2002 with media and community relations campaign. Street smarts is being rolled out to schools and neighborhoods and has received widespread regional support from Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), VTA, Caltrans, AAA, and CHP.
4. School Walking Route Maps – DOT provides schools with walking route maps as an educational tool. They are also included as handouts in the School Safety Education Program. Route maps also provide a tool for city engineers to identify areas in need of physical improvements
5. Pavement Embedded Crosswalk Lights – Applying to CALTRANS for 1-year extension of funding (beyond 6/30/03). Currently evaluating contracting options.
6. Automated Speed Radar Display Sign – Caltrans is asking DOT to apply for experimental status with CTCDC. We are on track to have 20 installed by Sept.
7. Safety Pedestrian Safety Committee – Advisory committee reviews and develops recommendations for crossing guard placement, and safety patrol issues.
8. City/Schools Collaborative – . DOT will continue involvement with the collaborative, and use it as a forum to discuss on-going school safety issues.
9. Operation Safe Passage – Countywide effort coordinated by the CHP. Involves 13 law enforcement agencies targeting enforcement of regulations in school zones. Occurs 3 x/year.
10. Avoid the Thirteen – Countywide effort with 13 law enforcement agencies. Anti-DUI education and enforcement campaign.
11. Sober Graduation – Education outreach aimed at HS seniors, includes mock DUI arrests, trials, jail, probation, etc. Includes presentations by traffic officers at school assemblies.
12. Every 15 Minutes – Education outreach aimed at HS juniors and seniors, includes a mock DUI fatal accident. Reinforced by 15 min. removal of students from classrooms thru-out the day.

13. Operation Outreach – Education outreach, similar to Every 15 Minutes. Involves mock accident scene and DUI investigation.
14. Operation Lifesaver – Education outreach for elementary students. Includes safety demonstrations on the use of buses, trains, light rail, bicycles, and pedestrian travel.
15. Officer Bill Presentations – Education outreach aimed at elementary students and offered to schools upon request. Involves presentations of traffic and personal safety.
16. Child Safety Seat Inspection – Participates in 10 safety inspections annually.
17. School Safety and Education Unit – responsible for recruiting and training school crossing guards, coordinate with schools to train and monitor Student Safety Patrols, and conducts school safety presentations on pedestrian and bicycle safety upon request.
