Dear Mayor Reed and Council Members,

The Campus Community Association (CCA) advocates clean and safe neighborhoods where residents may build their lives safely and have the opportunity to enhance their prosperity. It has come to our attention that our neighbors on Terrace Drive are in a struggle to ensure their safety and are finding their opportunities for prosperity through home ownership have been reduced due to an environmental hazard beneath their homes.

The City of San Jose's past disposal practices have contaminated the land under the homes on Terrace Drive. The city has two major responsibilities to its residents; public safety and land use. The city appears to have fallen short on both responsibilities on Terrace Drive. We understand that despite clean up efforts the homeowners on Terrace Drive are now still being held liable for any ill effects resulting from the contamination and are being held liable for any residual contamination. This does not appear to be a safe environment in which to live. The city is also responsible for land use and should take responsibility for allowing development on a known waste disposal site. To that end, the city should work with the homeowners on remediation of the contamination and/or reasonable compensation for the loss in property value due to the contamination.

The CCA urges the City of San Jose to work in good faith with the residents of Terrace Drive and resolve these issues of public safety, land use, and just compensation.

Re: THE GHETTO LIFE: UPDATE ON THE SCEP

On Monday, (04.13.09) approximately 1044 hours, I ventured over to North Tenth Street @ Horning Street to "take the pulse" of the SCEP (Shopping Cart Entitlement Program). I arrived on station and found six (6) stolen and abandoned shopping carts *A 120% increase of theft of shopping carts from last Wednesday is hereby recorded.*

The garbage at this locale was again minimal. Garbage was mainly contained in three stolen and abandoned shopping carts. However, a "City 32 gallon garbage can" (I.D. # 032066778) was noted at the aforementioned locale, full to overflowing with garbage. Could this be a City sponsored effort to curb the garbage problem at this locale? Or was it the unilateral act of a member of the destitute or criminal element doing his or her part to regain self respect and service to the community?

The breakdown of ownership of the stolen and abandoned shopping carts is as follows;

Safeway (1), Trader Joe's (1), Walgreen's (1), Costco (1), WalMart (1) and Mi pueblo (1).

*****special note***** the overall cleanliness of Shopping carts in stores should be addressed by some government agency. Unsuspecting customers may use excrement coated shopping carts without knowledge.

Someone donated an "industrial sized" bag of popcorn on the top of the Safeway and WalMart stolen and abandoned shopping carts (the carts were stuck together). One thief did partake of the free popcorn.

Welfare Check of the Railroad Tracks Resident(s) undertaken.

A "welfare check" to establish the status of any and all occupant(s) along the railroad tracks proceeding Northbound, approximately one hundred and twenty (120) yards on the railroad tracks from North Tenth Street @ Horning Street; *was* carried out.

No one was visible; however garbage is increasing along railroad property which is used as a transit corridor for the criminal and destitute element.

"Gang" related graffiti is on the increase. Some of this graffiti shows unique artistic talent.

There were no interviews this week

One of Manuel's roosters was out on railroad property. The color characteristics of the rooster were; a black underbelly and tail feathers with multi-colored beige wing feathers. As roosters go, he was an arrogant little cuss in need of being roasted with some root vegetables at the kitchen of the County Jail.
