





**SUBJECT: REQUEST TO ADD AN ITEM TO THE COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (CED) COMMITTEE WORKPLAN**

## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Rules and Open Government Committee approve the addition of a discussion of policy alternatives related to the exemption of park impact fees (PDO/PIO) for affordable housing developments on the October agenda for the Community and Economic Development Committee.

## OUTCOME

The outcome would be to have a discussion of the data, financial analyses and policy alternatives prior to City Council consideration.

## BACKGROUND

Currently, affordable units constructed in San Jose are exempt from payment of the City's Park Development Ordinance/Park Impact Ordinance (PDO/PIO) fees. This City policy has been in place since the Housing Department was created in 1988. However, as part of the approval for a Citywide Inclusionary Housing Policy, the City Council directed staff to report back on the potential policy options and financial impacts if affordable housing were to pay PDO/PIO.
