

RESOLUTION NO. 73174

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE APPROVING THE LIST OF PROPOSED PROJECTS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007 TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT, ARTICLE 3 (TDA 3) GRANT FUNDING, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE THE NECESSARY GRANT DOCUMENTS TO EFFECTUATE THE GRANT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$745,833

WHEREAS, Attachment A of this Resolution, which is incorporated herein as fully set forth, contains a list of projects that the City of San José ("City") is proposing for fiscal year 2006-2007 under the State Transportation Development Act, Article 3 (TDA 3) grant funding program for the improvement of the pedestrian and bicycle transportation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of funding requested by the City in order to implement all of the proposed pedestrian and bicycle projects identified in Attachment A is \$745,833; and

WHEREAS, the proposed projects have been found to be categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970 as amended, under File No. PP 06-073;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE THAT:

1. The list of proposed bicycle and pedestrian projects identified in Attachment A of this resolution for the State Transportation Development Act, Article 3 (TDA 3) grant funding program for fiscal year 2006-2007 is hereby approved, and the Director of the Department of Transportation is directed to transmit this list of proposed projects to the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority.

2. The City Manager is authorized to negotiate and execute the necessary grant documents to effectuate the grant funding from the Transportation Development Act, Article 3 (TDA 3) grant program funds awarded to the City for fiscal year 2006-2007 for any of the projects contained in Attachment A of this Resolution, in an amount not to exceed \$745,833.

School Access & Sidewalk Improvements

| 1. | <u>Hedding Street: 9th Street to 10th Street</u> – Install sidewalk, driveway apron, curb and gutter and remove abandoned railroad tracks on south side of Hedding Street. Hedding Street currently has no sidewalks in this area on either side. (CD 3) | \$184,000 |
| 2. | <u>Grandview Drive at Capital Avenue</u> – Install sidewalk on the southeast corner. This project will close a sidewalk gap on Grandview Drive and provide continuous sidewalks to Capitol Avenue Light Rail and bus service. Currently, there are no continuous sidewalks in this area on either side of Grandview Drive. (CD 4) | \$31,000 |
| 3. | <u>Huff Avenue at Baywood Avenue</u> – Install sidewalk, curb, gutter, driveway apron and curb ramps on the north side of Huff Avenue, east and west of Baywood Avenue. Install a ramp on the southwest corner. This project will fill a sidewalk gap and improve access to Monroe Middle School. (CD 6) | \$226,000 |
| 4. | <u>Woodard Road at Farnham Elementary School</u> – Install sidewalk, curb and gutter and curb ramps on the north of Woodard Road connecting Twilight Drive with Farnham Elementary School. (CD 9) | \$156,000 |

| 5. | <u>Citywide Curb Ramps</u> – Install approximately 60 curb ramps. These funds will supplement the City's existing curb ramp installation program. (Citywide) | \$100,000 |
| 6. | <u>Pedestrian & Bicycle Facility Signing and Striping</u> – Stripe crosswalks and install other pedestrian facility improvements; stripe bike lanes and install other bicycling improvements. (Citywide) | \$13,833 |
| 7. | <u>Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Education</u> – Through the City's School Safety Program, provide safe walking and bicycling education in the City's grade K-9 schools. Provide adult Safe Bicycling courses to the public six (6) times per year. (Citywide) | \$35,000 |
