SPECIAL TAX AND BOND ELECTION

This ballot is for a special, landowner election. You must return this ballot in the enclosed postage paid envelope to the City Clerk of the City of San Jose no later than immediately after adoption of the resolution of the City Council calling said election, either by mail or in person.

To vote, mark a cross (X) on the voting line after the word ‘YES’ or after the word ‘NO’. All marks otherwise made are forbidden. All distinguishing marks are forbidden and make the ballot void.

If you wrongly mark, tear, or deface this ballot, return it to the City Clerk of the City of San Jose and obtain another.

BALLOT MEASURE: Shall the City of San Jose incur an indebtedness and issue bonds in one or more series in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$15,000,000, with interest at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate permitted by law at the time of sale of such bonds on behalf of the City of San Jose Community Facilities District No. 10 (Hassler — Silver Creek) (the “District”), the proceeds of which will be used only to finance the costs of roadway improvements specified in the Resolution of Intention to form the District and the costs of issuing the bonds as well as the establishment of a bond reserve fund; shall a special tax payable solely from lands within the District be levied annually upon lands within the District to be applied only to the payment of the principal and interest upon such bonds to be issued and to replenish the reserve fund for the bonds and to pay the costs of the City in administering the District; and shall the annual appropriations limit of the District be established in the amount of \$15,000,000?
