- In Santa Clara County, women earn less than men in almost all major industries and minorities are more likely to work in lower paying fields.^[iv]

Numerous studies indicate that raising the minimum wage will not trigger job loss, but will instead amount to a higher amount of purchasing power in the local economy. The Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago found that for every \$1 that the minimum wage was increased, personal household spending increased \$2,800 over the course of a year.^[vii] In contrast, quick calculations show us that a person making the California minimum wage over the course of a 50-week work year, will make \$13,069.50 assuming no dependents or deductions are claimed. Per HUD affordable housing guidelines assumed by the City's Housing Department, this person would qualify for extremely low income (ELI) housing, and would only be able to budget \$326.73 per month for rent.

On behalf of the Board of DAWN, we appreciate your work and attention to this significant and impactful piece of legislation in San Jose, and we hope that you'll consider these factors when making your decision to support the adoption of this initiative. As the 10th largest city in America, we are excited to support those Councilmembers who understand and actively work to address the economic inequities facing women today.
