Hi Laurel,

I understand that the City is considering redistricting portions of District 6 and District 9. My neighborhood is bounded by Meridian Avenue, Curtner Avenue, Leigh Avenue and Dry Creek. We moved to the neighborhood in 1979 when my parents purchased a Jules Duc home in the old cherry orchards along Maykirk. I played in Lincoln Glen Little League and would have attended Booksin and Willow Glen like most of the kids in the neighborhood do now. My wife and I loved the neighborhood so much that we bought our Brown and Kaufman home (most of the homes in this neighborhood were built by Brown and Kaufman in the 1960s) in 2001 on Glenkirk Drive---a stones throw from where I grew up. I guess that makes me a second generation Willow Glen resident and my four kids third generation.

There is no doubt that my neighbors consider this area to be Willow Glen, not Cambrian. In fact, the area currently lies is in the boundaries of the WG neighborhood association. It seems to me that the existing borders of Leigh and Curtner make logical sense to divide the districts. Willow Glen should not be divided by council districts.

Many of my neighbors will oppose this redistricting effort. I hope the City will consider looking at other neighborhoods for inclusion in District 9.
