**Subject:** Redistricting

Dear Councilman Oliverio:

I was totally distressed to hear that there is a plan afoot to redistrict and place our neighborhood into District 9, Cambrian, taking it out of District 6, Willow Glen. To take such an action without promoting this proposed change and giving the residents a say in this action is absolutely ludicrous.

We moved into this neighborhood ( ) in 1980. We selected this neighborhood because of the schools, churches, Little League Opportunities, and availability of so many services in the immediate area and on Lincoln Avenue.

Our son went to Booksin and St. Christopher's School; we attend St Chris and have worked for this parish for over 30 years. We patronize the stores in this area, Safeway, Aqui, and all of those along Lincoln Avenue. In other words, we have always considered ourselves to be residents of Willow Glen not Cambrian.

Our housing prices are based on Willow Glen Property values, not Cambrian. Such a redistricting will undoubtedly have a negative effect on our property values. In the severe economic downturn we are currently experiencing, I and my neighbors do not need another reason for potential lower valuations of our properties because of the perceived value of neighboring houses, and the description of the area in which we are located.

We are dead-set against this redistricting – taking the Leigh, Meridian, Dry Creek and Curtner area – and making it part of District 9. We have focused our votes to elect you as our City Council representative and are very pleased that we have. We know nothing about the City Council rep in District 9, and have no desire to be represented by anyone but you.

Please forward this to the appropriate personnel, and advise if there will be a public hearing.
